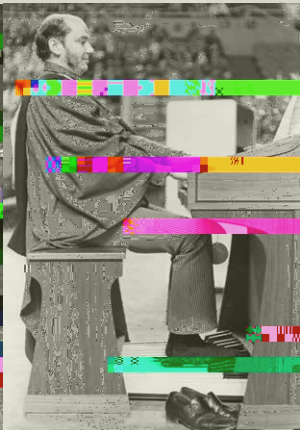
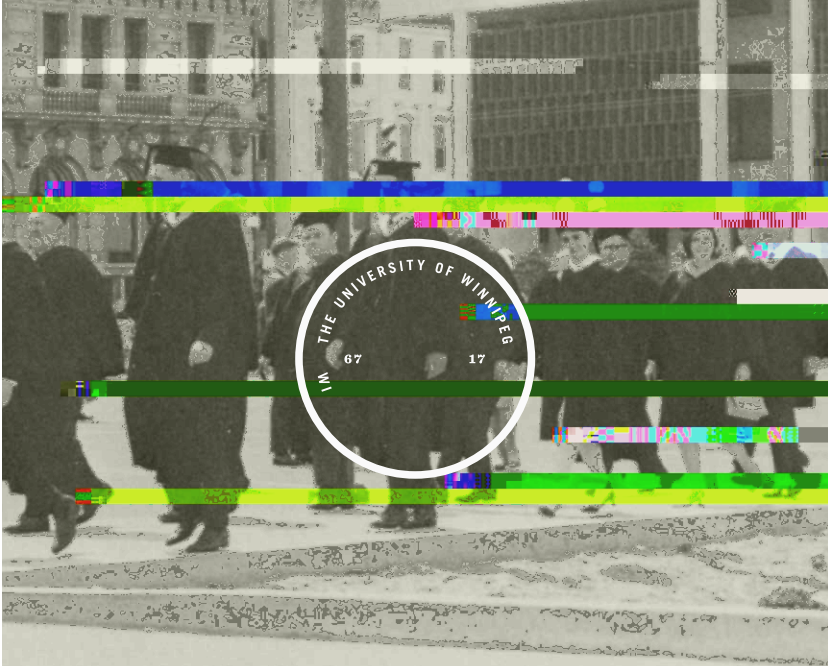
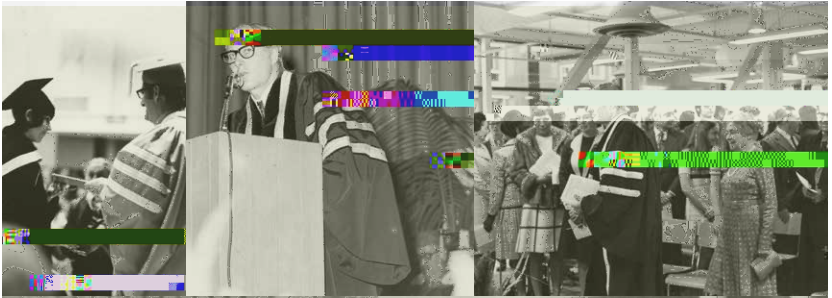

Dr Jack Zipes is a world renowned scholar of fair tale studies and childrens literature. He is a strong contributor to the intellectual life of many communities including that of faculty and students at The University of Winnipeg.

As Professor Emeritus of the University of Minnesota, Zipes is a multi-lingual scholar whose academic career spans more than 50 years and includes the publication of 20 books in English and German in addition to numerous essays. His impact is far-reaching; he shifted the field of study of traditional texts directed to young people with his insight that folk and fair tales must be read within the historical, economic, social, and cultural contexts of their production. His influence has been felt by many at the University of Winnipeg where the study of childrens literature has been an institutional strength for decades.

Zipes visited the University of Winnipeg annually from 1990 to 2015, presenting well-attended public talks, holding teaching sessions with students and colleagues, and tirelessly mentoring and supporting the academic journeys of others. Most recently, he gifted his unique and rich collection of fair tale films to the University of Winnipeg library, the largest database of fair tale films in the world. This peerless collection of resource material cements the University of Winnipeg as the place to conduct research in this area.

By tenaciously championing the humanities and imagination as powerful forces in enabling social justice, Zipes is an inspiration internationally. The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Dr. Jack Zipes with this

Dr Patricia Fitzpatrick has made significant contributions to environmental, social and economic sustainability at The University of Winnipeg and within the wider community. Her work over the last years has focused on digital



Dr Narad Rampersad is a knowledgeable and gifted researcher with an exceptional publication record who has garnered international recognition for the quality of his work. He is considered to be one of the best of his generation.

His expertise spans a variety of areas in discrete mathematics including formal languages, automata theory, descriptive complexity, pattern avoidance, and number theory, but is internationally renowned for his research in combinatorics on words, the study of patterns in sequences over a finite set of symbols.

Rampersad is known for his clever and intricate solutions to hard problems that others have been unable to solve. His postdoctoral fellowship at UWinnipeg, with Dr. James Currie, mathematically and statistically jointly resolved the last remaining open cases of a long-standing conjecture in combinatorics on words known as Dejean's Conjecture. The final step to this solution represents one of the most important results in combinatorics on words in the last years.

As a young researcher, he has already made an impressive mark in his field with conference publications, journal publications, and a chapter for a Cambridge University Press publication.

Rampersad's initial Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) Discovery Grant received funding over the years as a significant reward for a first-time applicant in mathematics. He also has received The University of Winnipeg Award of Merit for each of the years from

Rampersad has supervised several undergraduate research projects and co-supervised two postdoctoral researchers. Each project generated papers published in or submitted to refereed general and design publications on research in the field. He has been a member of the Technical Board of the

For countless UWinnipeg students, staff, and faculty facing stress, Barb Read has been a compassionate and calming influence.

Annie McBain graduates from a year Honours degree program in Religion and Culture with an impressive academic and research track record. She has consistently produced high quality research papers while maintaining a strong grade point average.

Additionally, McBain worked as a research assistant for Dr. Carlos Colorado and the Centre for the Liberal Arts and Secular Society (CLASS), assisting with the production of a documentary on religion, secularism, and public life in Canada. In her work for Dr. Colorado, she helped conduct interviews with a number of prominent

leaders including a significant number of authors and public intellectuals.

## THE UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG COAT OF ARMS

The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of The University during the academic session of 1967. The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesleyan Colleges the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The grape symbol has its origin in the College seal adopted in the charter of 1827. The cross, the lamp and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesleyan College designed in 1827 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross, the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity, was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield, the

symbol of protection. The lamp, the symbol of light, also represents learning to which the Colleges have been devoted for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book, representing instruction in the pursuit of life and the bringing of understanding to the student, symbolizes knowledge in a general sense although it may carry connotations of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.

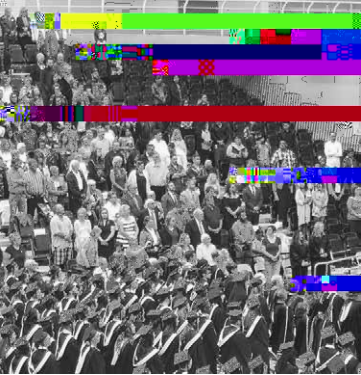
The motto placed upon a scroll below is the United College motto here retained: *Lux et Veritas Floreant* Let Light and Truth Flourish. While The University of Winnipeg received its charter in 1967, the institution's roots stretch back more than 150 years to an era of unprecedented growth and energy that gripped Winnipeg at the turn of the last century. In 1827, Manitoba College and Wesleyan College joined forces to become United College, founded on the ideal that faith and politics can intersect to create lasting social change.
