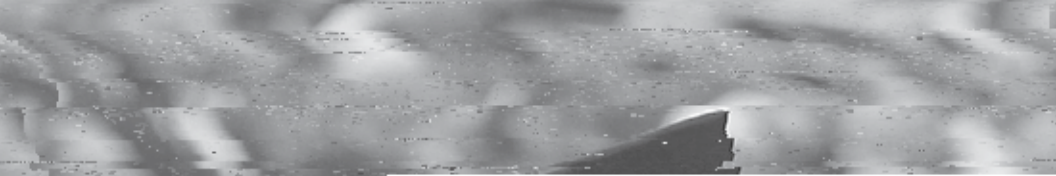

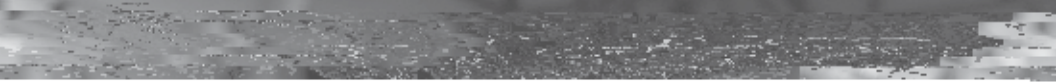

A celebrated actor of First Nations and Métis descent, Tantoo Cardinal has broken barriers for onscreen representations of Indigenous peoples. She has played more than 120 roles on stage and in film and television throughout her nearly 50-year career, blazing a trail for future Indigenous artists.

Her most famous roles include those in multiple Academy Award winner *Dances with Wolves* and Academy Award nominee *Legends of the Fall*, along with her U.S. television role in *Stumptown* on ABC. Allan Levine is a passionate, award-winning storyteller who's spent his career bringing history to life and commenting on current events. If you've picked up one of his books, you know they're hard to put down.

Well-known for his work as a historian, writer, and public intellectual, Levine was also an educator for nearly 30 years. He taught history and world issues at St. John's-Ravenscourt School from 1984-2012 and was an instructor with the Asper Foundation Holocaust Education Program from 1999-2012.

In 1987, Levine became a published author – releasing his first book, *The Exchange: 100 Years of Trading Grain in Winnipeg*. He has written more than a dozen published books, both fiction and non-fiction, and has delved into the historical mystery genre.

However, he's arguably best known for his work covering Jewish history in Canada. In particular, his 2009 book *Coming of Age: A History of Jewish People in Manitoba* won numerous accolades, including McNally-Robinson Book of the Year,

Best History Book Award at the 2010 Canadian Jewish Book Awards, and co-winner of the J.I. Segal Prize in Canadian Jewish History.

A comprehensive and accessible history of the Jews of Manitoba, *Coming of Age* reflects what is already known about the community, introduces new material, and casts an eye at the 130-year history of Jews in Manitoba from the earliest days of settlement in 1880 to the present.

Augmenting Levine's work as an author are more than 500 of his comment pieces and reviews, which have appeared in publications such as the *Globe and Mail*, *Maclean's*, and the *National Post*. He has been a columnist with the *Winnipeg Free Press* since 2010, explaining the history behind current events.

For bringing history to life and sharing his scholarly knowledge with the general public through his prolific writing in newspapers and magazines, The University of Winnipeg is proud to honour Allan Levine with an Honorary Doctor of Laws.

Dr. Alberto Civetta has built an international reputation for research excellence and inspiring mentorship.

Since arriving at The University of Winnipeg two decades ago, he has made significant contributions to the field of evolutionary genetics, and has secured an unbroken chain of funding in the process. He currently holds the largest individual NSERC Discovery Grant at UWinnipeg.

Civetta is a highly respected leader in the field of speciation genetics. He has published countless papers, spoken at international conferences, and served on various editorial boards and grant review panels.

His research led to the identification of a new subspecies of *Drosophila* (common fruit fly) from what scientists previously considered a new species.

Carlos Colorado is an associate professor in the Department of Religion and Culture. During his exemplary career at UWinnipeg, he has emerged as a campus leader and public intellectual, with a visionary commitment to bringing the academy and community together.

As founder of the Centre for the Liberal Arts and Secular Society (CLASS) research network and the Axworthy Distinguished Lecture Series (ALS), Colorado has helped

His ability to turn practicum experience into a transformative student experience that highlights human rights issues is evident in his book *Stories of Transformation: Memories of a Global*

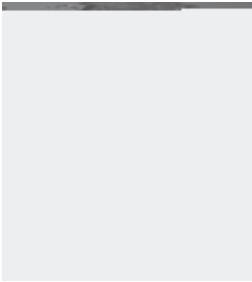

For always going above and beyond to help her students and colleagues, The University of Winnipeg is proud to honour Deb Bradley with the Stars of Spence Street Award. Her kindness, dedication, and generosity make her a truly worthy recipient.

Gabor Kunstatter is a highly reputed scientist, scholar, teacher, and administrator. He is considered an authority in gravitation theory, especially in the areas of black hole physics and quantum gravity. He has served in a range of academic positions – including as departmental chair and the Dean of Science – while teaching, supervising students, and doing research with rigour.

Kunstatter's research on exotic black holes shed light on fundamental problems of gravitation theory and also serves as a testing ground to study interactions between gravity and quantum fields in extreme conditions. His work illuminates the fundamental problem of gravity that has been puzzling theoreticians for the past century.

Kunstatter is well regarded in the international physics community. He has co-edited seven proceedings of national and international conferences and authored 138 journal papers, including his highly cited single-authored paper "d-Dimensional Black Hole Entropy from Quasi-Normal Modes," which was published in the prestigious *Physical Review Letters* and established his scientific mark. A second-year physics textbook that he wrote will be published this year.

During his career, Kunstatter received an impressive total of \$1.27 million for theoretical physics, via Discovery Grants from the Natural Sciences and Eng0 -1. Quasi-Noork illum

Remembered as a committed researcher and resourceful teacher, Dr. Murray Wiegand devoted more than 30 years of service to the University of Winnipeg's Department of Biology prior to his retirement in August 2019.

Wiegand completed a post-doctoral fellowship at Memorial University in St. John's, Newfoundland prior to arriving at UWinnipeg in 1984.

While Wiegand put a particular focus on work surrounding fish lipids and the reproductive physiology of freshwater fish, he further distinguished himself with an unrelenting commitment to his work. His versatility was also of note, having adeptly navigated the broad curriculum that the Department of Biology offers and teaching in multiple aspects of it along the way.

In the latter portion of his time at UWinnipeg, Wiegand assumed stewardship of the department's honours program as a major part of his teaching responsibilities in the undergraduate program. He welcomed the challenge – and the opportunity to guide

students from their undergraduate work to independent research – with open arms, a trait for which he had become known during his decades of service.

Wiegand also devoted himself to issues outside his classroom for the benefit of the university; he served on numerous departmental and institutional committees and as coordinator of the Biochemistry program. He also served as trustee of the University of Winnipeg Pension Plan, a role in which he is continuing after retirement.

Wiegand earned a reputation among colleagues as a well-rounded academic who enjoyed a challenge, and also as a diligent researcher who prioritized accuracy and generation of reliable data.

For his diverse body of work and his steadfast commitment to the betterment of both the Department of Biology and the students whose lives he impacted, the University of Winnipeg is proud to honour Dr. Murray Wiegand as Professor Emeritus.

David Fitzpatrick established an award-winning legacy at the University of Winnipeg over a 25-year career in which he contributed to many significant developments across campus.

After distinguishing himself as a teacher in the Winnipeg School Division, and a physical education consultant at the Department of Education, Fitzpatrick joined UWinnipeg in 1990. He began as an instructor-rank faculty member in the Physical Activity and Sport Studies (PASS) program and after completing his PhD, was named an associate professor, and later full professor.

After PASS was restructured as a department, Fitzpatrick sat as the department's first Chair until 2004 when he was recruited to take on the role of Associate Dean of Arts. He eventually became the Dean of Arts and held that distinguished position until 2012.

Fitzpatrick returned to his roots in 2012 with an appointment as the founding Dean of the Faculty of Kinesiology. That role provided unprecedented responsibility for Fitzpatrick, who was tasked not only with guiding a new faculty through its infancy, but also the substantial duty of overseeing, with others, the design and construction of what would become the Axworthy Health and RecPlex.

The RecPlex initiative was a profound infrastructure development for the campus and Fitzpatrick played a major role in guiding the university through many challenges. The multisport facility has become a centrepiece on campus and in the community, and serves as a testament to Fitzpatrick's commitment and attention to detail.

Fitzpatrick's reputation as a fair-minded contributor to a variety of committees and task forces on campus earned him the 2015 Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance.

Fitzpatrick took pride in his teaching, specifically the development and delivery of courses in motor behaviour, an area of study in kinesiology. He had an active research program, focussing on children and youth with disabilities, in particular, Developmental Coordination Disorder – and was a co-recipient of a major SSHRC grant.

For a multi-faceted career that contributed greatly to a burgeoning era for the university's campus and its academics, the University of Winnipeg is pleased to honour David Fitzpatrick with Fellowship in United College.

Tina Keeper is from the Inninuk of Norway House Cree Nation in the Treaty 5 territory and of the Muskrat Dam First Nation of the Treaty 9 territory. She is a film, television, and theatre producer; actor; advocate; and former Member of Parliament.

Her passion for the arts was influenced by her culture, and she explored theatre at the Winnipeg Indian and Métis Friendship Centre back in 1980, and through the acting program at The University of Winnipeg. She has a BA in theatre from The University of Winnipeg and trained at the Centre for Indigenous Theatre, the Banff Centre, and the Sundance Institute.

Keeper won a Gemini award for acting in 1997 for her portrayal of RCMP Officer Michelle Kenidi in the long-running television series *North of 60*. She was the first Indigenous person to win a Gemini for a leading role on a TV series in Canada.

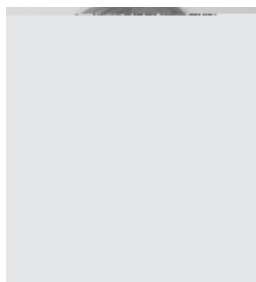
As an Honorary Witness for the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, Keeper co-produced the Royal Winnipeg Ballet's highly acclaimed ballet *Going Home Star*, guided by Indian Residential School Survivors.

Keeper served as a Member of Parliament for the federal riding of Churchill from 2006-2008. She was the first Indigenous woman to serve as a Member of Parliament from Manitoba. In 2008, she introduced

a Private Member's Bill into the House that would ensure Canadian laws are consistent with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, and introduced a Private Member's Bill regarding Jordan's Principle to address First Nations children's healthcare in Canada.

She served as a Member of Parliament from 2006-2008. She was the first Indigenous woman to serve as a Member of Parliament from Manitoba. In 2008, she introduced
