



Strategic Direction:Academic E cellence and Rene al

COVID-19 contin ed to present UWinnipeg ill a series of challenges thro gho t the 2021-22 academic ear. Despite these challenges, UWinnipeg fac It s cceeded at pro iding high-q alit ed cational e periences, both in-person and online. Enrolment remains stable, and e contin e to attract ne st dents from aro nd the orld. Nearl 1600 international st dents ere registered in the fall of 2021.

In ne programming, the 2021 academic ear also introd ced a ne Bachelor of Arts in Indigeno s Lang ages, ith its rst cohort of three st dents registering in the fall term. In the past ear, PACE partnered ith S ppl Chain Canada to allo grad ates of the S ppl Chain Management Program to be eligible for ad anced standing in earning their designation as S ppl Chain Management Professionals.

Work contin es in eq it, di ersit and incl sion nder the NSERC grant and Dimensions pilot project. In the inter of 2022, H man Reso rces cond cted an eq it s r e to establish a more acc rate nderstanding of the make p of UWinnipeg's fac lt and staff.

Reimagining How We Teach Math

Dr. Anna Stokke is an ambassador for math ed cation hose high standard of teaching and research inspires st dent s ccess.

Her commitment to teaching e cellence has been recognired ith a series of a ards, incl ding most recentl a 2021 3M National Teaching Fello ship Canada's most prestigio s recognition of e cellence in post-secondar teaching and ed cational leadership. She balances inno ati e classroom teaching ith comm nit ser ice, a high le el of

administrati e leadership, NSERC-f nded research, and media a ailabilit for inter ie s on math ed cation.

Whether mentoring ad anced math majors indertaking complicated research projects or teaching irst- ear st idents, she incorporates techniq es like scaffolding to introd ice ne concepts in incremental steps that allo is tidents to e perience s coess faster. Her belief that mathematics can and sho lid be accessible to eight error or one inspires st in dents to engage, eight, and since coed.



The 2021-22 academic school ear sa st dents ret rning to camp s in the fall and spring/s mmer terms. COVID-19 accine and mask mandates ere implemented in September 2021.

In late 2021, UWinnipeg administered its S r e of Grad ated St dents to former st dents ho had grad ated in 2019. Grad ates reported positi e o tcomes, ith onl 4% e periencing nemplo ment at the time of the s r e . In addition, grad ates fo nd that their ed cations ere helpf I in acq iring emplo ment, ith 81% reporting their degrees ere er helpf I or some hat helpf I in getting their job.




Indigenous Course Requirement (ICR)¹

These records ere obtained sing access to information and freedom of information req ests s bmitted to go ernments across Canada. The Prison Pandemic Papers ere created as a reso rce for imprisoned people and their lo ed ones, comm nit organivers and ad ocates, researchers, jo rnalists, la ers, polic makers, and members of the p blic to learn abo tho go ernments are responding to COVID-19.

Research E cellence, Kno ledge Mobili, ation, and Impact



Dr. Yadira Chinique de Armas (Anthropology)

Dr. Chiniq e de Armas and recent grad ate Kaitl n Hanson (BSc, Hons 2021) are part of a team of researchers de eloping a ne , inno ati e approach to nderstanding ancient infant feeding beha ior. While st d ing the b rials of Bac ranao I, a prehistoric Indigeno s pop lation from Ma abeg e, C ba, the research team de eloped and applied a no el approach that combines different isotope s stems and tiss et pes, pro iding a m ch more detailed and precise reconstraction of ancient infant feeding practices s chase cl si e breastfeeding, the introd ction of eaning foods, and the timing of the o erall eaning process.

This research con rmed the abilit of m lti-pro approaches, s ch as combining different isotope s stems and tiss es, to reconstrict breastfeeding and eaning practices in archaeolog ith improed resolution. We also present no el stable isotope data deri ed from decid o s teeth enamel hich demonstrates that changes in diet can be detected in teeth formed diring earlinfanc.

The northern pop lations are doing er ell and there are man opport nities to catch troph lake tro t. In the so theast, the pop lations are less prod cti e and recreational angling opport nities mabe s ffering. Generall, the share smaller, and more shing effort is needed to capt re lake tro t.



Strategic Direction:Financial and Instit tional Resilience

UWinnipeg introd ced a modest 3.75% t ition increase for the 2021-22 academic ear. This ear's b dget also incl ded a 1.8% red ction in the base operating grant from the pro incial go ernment. S bstantial re en e as lost from camp s operations d e to COVID-19 -- most notabl in ancillar ser ices like ho sing, parking, printing, and recreational space rental.

PACE remains a so rce of f nding stabilit, e end ring the pandemic, ith contrib tions of \$3.8 million. The PACE AnX Centre also celebrated its grand opening in December 2021.

The Camp s S stainabilit Of ce released its 2020-21 ann al report, hich re ected the changes in reso rce se hen the camp s closed d e to the pandemic. The e pectation is that this data ill be sed to inform ne goals related to beha io r change on camp s.




Recognitions
